PASTOR NOTE

Feast of the Assumption: Thursday, August 15th is a Holy Day of Obligation celebrating the Assumption of Mary. On this day we recall that Mary was taken up directly, body and soul, into heaven. Masses will be offered on Wed. Aug. 14, 6pm; Thurs. Aug. 15, 7am and 5:15pm.

Mass Bells: Recently, Mass bells from St. Mary, Tiskilwa, were installed near the front doors of St. Louis church. For centuries, bells have been rung to signal the start of Mass. We will continue this tradition. At the right time, I will ring the Mass bells, everyone will stand, and we will begin the hymn for Mass. I hope you enjoy this new tradition.

Tiskilwa Liturgical Items: Recently, I have brought various liturgical items from St. Mary, Tiskilwa. These include a monstrance, chalices, statues and other items. St. Louis will begin using these items as a way to continue the legacy of St. Mary parish. The statues are beautiful and from a by-gone era. Soon, I will place these statues around the parish. They include a statue of the Sacred Heart, the Infant of Prague, the Blessed Mother, St. Joseph, and St. Therese of Lisieux. I hope that these items will enhance our liturgy and worship.

Everylife Diapers: Last week I explained that the Magi Baby Chest has entered a partnership with Everylife Diaper Company, which is completely pro-life. I encourage you to consider purchasing diapers from Everylife and having them shipped to the parish for the Magi Baby Chest. They have a wonderful program called "Buy for a Cause." Through this program you donate the cost for a diaper bundle, which is then applied to a pregnancy center.

St. Louis Feast Day: Sunday, August 25th is the Feast Day of St. Louis, our parish patron. In the past our parish has joined for a special Mass and Dinner. This year our parish feast day is complicated. August 25th is a Sunday and so we cannot actually celebrate the Mass in honor of St. Louis. Sunday almost always takes priority over a saint's feast. Also, that weekend is the County Fair, which would probably take priority over a parish dinner. To celebrate our patronal feast day this year, the Altar & Rosary Society will host coffee & donuts/pastries in Harkrader Hall after the 7:30am, 9am, and 10:30am Masses on Sunday, August 25th. I hope you can join us.

Kids return to School: This week our youth will return to school. Let's offer this prayer so that they will have a good school year:

Effects of Mortal Sin, continued:

The merits we have earned in the past with so much effort are likewise lost by mortal sin; we can only regain them by penance. Moreover, whilst we remain in the state of mortal sin, we can acquire no merits for heaven. What a waste of the supernatural!

To all this we must add the tyrannical yoke of servitude the sinner must from now on bear. Instead of "the yoke of the children of God," behold him now in the slavery...of sin, of evil passions now unloosed by the loss of grace, of habits soon formed after repeated falls—falls so difficult to avoid! "Whosoever commits sin is the servant of sin." Little by little the moral strength of the soul is sapped, actual grace becomes rarer, discouragement and at times despair ensue. This poor soul is lost unless God in His exceeding great mercy comes with His grace and rescues it from the abyss.

If unfortunately, the sinner remains obdurate to the end in his resistance to grace, then follows hell with all its horrors. Frist there is the well-deserved pain of loss. Grace had ever pursued the culprit, but he willingly died in his sin, that is he willingly died without God, and since his soul's dispositions can no longer change, he remains forever separated from Him. As long as he lived on earth absorbed in business or pleasure, he gave no time, no thought to the horror of his plight. But now there is neither business nor pleasure, and he faces constantly the harrowing reality. By the very constitution of his nature, by the cravings of his mind and of his heart, by the urge of his entire being, he is now uncontrollably driven towards Him, who is his first beginning and last end, his one principle of perfection and only source of bliss; drawn towards that loving Father, so worthy of love, who had adopted him as His offspring; toward the Redeemer of his soul, who had so loved him as to die upon the Cross for him. Yes, a ruthless force beyond his power, the force for sin, his own sin, hopelessly thrusts him back upon himself. Death has forever stayed his spirit, irretrievably fixed his dispositions. Having rejected God the very moment death overtook him he remains estranged from Him forever. Happiness and perfection are everlastingly beyond his quest; he remains attached to his sin and through sin to all that defiles and all that degrades: "Depart from me, ye cursed."
