# **PASTOR NOTE**

This month our parish will be participating in the Annual Diocesan Appeal (ADA) for the Diocese of Peoria. This is an opportunity to help the Diocese raise necessary funds for many ministries and apostolates that we as a single parish cannot provide. This week, parishioners throughout the Diocese will receive a mailing from Bishop Tylka asking for your support for the Appeal. This mailing will include information and a pledge card.

The Diocese has chosen this weekend as the parish ADA weekend. Because of Princeton's Homestead Festival, St. Louis parish will hold our ADA next weekend. Next week I will make a presentation about the Annual Diocesan Appeal. You will have the opportunity to complete a pledge card and make a donation. I ask you to prayerfully consider making a contribution to the Annual Appeal. Thank you for your continuing support of our parish, diocese and the work of the Church throughout the world.

**Thursday Men's Study Group:** Men of the parish are invited to attend the Men's Study Group on Thursday's, 6pm to 7:30pm. We will continue our study of the Church Fathers. We will begin meetings again on Thur. Sept. 19<sup>th</sup>.

**Youth Group:** High School youth are invited to our parish Youth Group. Generally, we meet on the second and fourth Sunday's, 6pm-7:30pm at the church. Our time includes a short spiritual presentation, social time with snacks, prayer time and a chance for confession. Our next meeting will be on Sunday, Sept. 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Parish Trivia Night: Mark your calendar! Our next Trivia Night will be Sat. Oct. 5<sup>th</sup>, 6:30pm.

Building Security: For quite some time, I have been working towards providing better security in our buildings. Currently, very often there is free access to many areas of the church, hall and catechetical center. I want to prevent this free access and the possibility of "squatters." I also want to provide greater security for CGS. These are the new security practices: (1) The main Parish Office door will continue to be locked. There is a camera and bell which allows easy entrance to the Parish Office and Harkrader Hall/Kitchen. (2) The Church will continue to be locked when not in use. You are invited to use the Eucharistic Chapel for prayer by using the code to unlock the door. Please contact the Parish Office to obtain the code. (3) There are two interior hall doors that will be locked. This will prevent regular access to the Catechetical Center. Rebekah Mead will provide instructions to CGS participants. (4) For those attending meetings in the Aquinas Library or volunteering for the MBC, please use the exterior door near the Magi Baby Chest. Participants will no longer enter through the Main Office door. Leaders of these meetings may contact the Parish Office for a key. (5) Aquinas Library may still be used by first checking at the Parish Office. Please contact me if you have questions.

**Fall Small Groups:** Our parish has enjoyed small group gospel reflections during Lent and last fall. Once again, we will have Fall Small Groups. These weekly Fall Small Group meetings will discuss the previous Sunday's Gospel guided by the reflection questions. The group will follow a type of *lectio divina*, which is reflective meditation on the Scriptures. Through this process, each member will have an encounter with Jesus through the Scriptures, through the small group members and through personal reflection. This process has helped many people grow in holiness and friendship with Jesus. The small group meetings require no preparation and no "homework," just the one-hour meeting. Of course, I hope that the small group experience will inspire each participant to personally go deeper in their relationship with Jesus through personal prayer, daily Mass, adoration, or other personal devotions

The Fall Small Groups will meet beginning the week of September 22<sup>nd</sup> and continue through the week of October 27<sup>th</sup>. Each meeting will be at the same time and will have the same members each week. I have scheduled the Fall Small Group meetings throughout the week as follows: Mon. 11am.; Mon., 6pm; Wed. 3:30pm; Thur. 1pm; Fri. 9am.

# The Spiritual Life: Excerpt from *The Spiritual Life* by Adolphe Tanquerey, Desclee and Co., Belgium, 1951.

The Effects of Deliberate Venial Sin:

In this life. Frequent deliberate venial sin deprives the soul of many graces, gradually lessens its fervor and predisposes it to moral sin.

Venial sin does not, indeed, take from the soul sanctifying grace or divine love, but it deprives it of the new graces, the increase of divine love and of the corresponding degree of glory that it could have acquired and that God meant to give. Is not this an enormous loss, the loss of a treasure worth far more than the entire world?

It causes a diminution of fervor, that is to say, a waning of that generosity whereby we give ourselves without reserve to God. This generosity presupposes a high ideal and an unrelenting effort to pursue it; but these two dispositions are incompatible with habitual venial sin.

The great danger that confronts us then is that of gradually drifting into mortal sin. Our tendencies towards forbidden pleasure gather strength, our will becomes weaker and God's graces are reduced. Then a moment comes when any surrender may be feared.

Our tendencies toward forbidden pleasures gather strength; the more we yield to this treacherous and insatiable enemy, the more it demands. (continued on next page)

## The Spiritual Life - (Continued)

This is the more to be dreaded, as God's graces are as a rule reduced in proportion to our infidelities. It is the law of Divine Providence that graces are given us according to our own dispositions and our own cooperation. This is the sense of the Gospel words: "For he that hath, to him shall be given, and he shall abound: but to him that hath not, from him shall be taken away that also which he hath.' By our attachment to venial sin, we offer resistance to grace, we hamper its action in our soul and therefore receive it in small measure. If, then, even with a greater abundance of grace we failed to make a stand against the disordered tendencies of our nature, shall we succeed in restraining them now with less grace and less strength? Besides, a soul lacking recollection and generosity hardly feels the promptings of the graces it receives; these are soon stifled by the turmoil of awakening passions. Lastly, grace cannot sanctify us except through the sacrifices it demands of us, whilst the habits of pleasure we have acguired by our attachment to venial faults render such sacrifices all the more difficult.
