PASTOR NOTE

Anniversary: On June 9, 2021, I became your pastor. I am so happy to have been serving you over these three years. And, I am happy to continue to serve you. I cannot fully express my gratitude to you for all of the kindnesses that you have shown me. I am grateful for your willingness to go along with me with our many new parish projects, especially our many devotional opportunities. Thank you for giving your time to our small group gospel reflections. I hope that it has been helpful for you to grow in faith. I am truly grateful for your helping make the Magi Baby Chest such a great success. It warms my heart to think of all the families that you have been assisting to make ends meet. Through these past three years I have enjoyed our many social activities such as monthly Wine and Cheese and weekly Euchre. I am grateful for your generous support as we have made a few improvements to our facilities such as replacing the air conditioning units for Harkrader Hall. The list of my gratitude can continue for many pages. I sum it up as my tremendous gratitude for our parish, which in so many ways I call family. As you know, our family is growing as we embrace the Growing Disciples parish mergers. As we implement the Bishop's decision, I am confident that great things will continue to happen for our parish as we begin a new chapter in our history. I have lots of ideas for the future. Please know of my prayers for you and your family. Please do not hesitate to call upon me for any assistance, especially in times of illness. I praise God for my time here now and in the future.

Haiti Donations: Over these months I have announced that our tradition of assisting a parish in Haiti can no longer continue. The civil unrest in that country makes it impossible to assist the parish. Some people requested that their donations be either returned or directed to another charity. The time for such requests has ended. About \$8,000 remains in this fund. I have decided to allocate \$1,500 to a Haitian medical mission. This will assist people in Haiti, but not our sister parish. I did not want to allocate more due to the civil unrest in Haiti. Instead, I have allocated \$6,400 to the African Mission in Cameroon coordinated by Sr. Anne Germaine's religious order. I see this African missionary activity as somewhat similar to our assistance to the parish in Haiti. At this time, our parish will no longer accept donations for Haiti. Maybe at some far time in the future, we may take up this missionary work again.

Totus Tuus: Our annual Totus Tuus religious retreat for parish youth begins next Sunday, June 16th. I encourage families to sign up for this wonderful time of fun and spiritual renewal.

Remember that each day of Totus Tuus we will have an extra Mass at 11:15am. Everyone is invited to attend this Mass with our parish youth.

We once again will have a parish pot luck on Wednesday, June 19, at 5pm in Harkrader Hall. This dinner is for all the parish, not just Totus Tuus participants. Everyone is invited. This year we have something new and wonderful for our pot luck. A family has generously donated and arranged for the **Sisler's Ice Cream Cart** to provide delicious ice cream for dinner. Everyone attending the dinner can enjoy a delicious ice cream dessert. I am truly grateful for this donation. What a great treat!

The Spiritual Life: Excerpt from *The Spiritual Life* by Adolphe Tanquerey, Desclee and Co., Belgium, 1951.

- Summary of Method of Mental Prayer of St. Sulpice:
- 1. Preparation
 - a. Proximate:
 - i. The night before, to choose the subject of the meditation. To foresee in particular, the considerations and requests we are to make and the resolutions we are to take.
 - ii. To remain henceforth in great recollection and keep in our mind the subject of the meditation while going to sleep.
 - iii. Upon rising in the morning, to avail ourselves of the first free time to make our meditation.

b. Immediate:

- i. To humble ourselves before God at the sight of our sins. Contrition. Recitation of the Confiteor. Act of union with God.
- ii. To acknowledge ourselves incapable of prayer as we ought. Invocation of the Holy Spirit.
- 2. Body of Meditation
 - a. 1st Point: Adoration
 - i. To consider the subject of our meditation in God, in our Lord, or in one of saints. His sentiments, words, actions.
 - ii. To offer our homage: adoration, admiration, praise, thanksgiving, love, joy, or compassion
 - b. 2nd Point: Jesus in our Heart
 - i. To convince ourselves of the necessity or important of the virtue through motives of faith, through reasoning or through a detailed examination.
 - ii. To reflect on our conduct with sorrow for the past, confusion for the present, and desire for the future.
 - iii. To beseech God to grant us the virtue upon which we are meditating. (It is chiefly through this prayer that we participate in the virtues of our Lord). To beg also of God whatever else we need, to pray for the needs of the Church, and of all those for whom we are bound to pray.

THE LITURGICAL CORNER

The principal priest in any diocese is the bishop. A bishop has the fullness of the priesthood. Some larger dioceses are designated an archdiocese, the bishop is an archbishop. In the Liturgy, three symbols designate the bishop of the diocese:

- the miter, or ornamental hat with two tassels hanging down the back. It is a sign of his office as bishop. The two tassels signify the Old and New Testaments.
- the crosier. This is the pastoral staff of the bishop, normally shaped like a shepherd's crook. The bishop is the chief shepherd of the diocese.
- the ring. Less visible than the miter and crosier, the ring has a special significance. Just as husbands and wives exchange rings at their weddings, the bishop is 'married' to his diocese. Hence, he too wears a 'wedding ring.' Incidentally, there is one day each year when the bishop does *not* wear the ring: Good Friday, in order to symbolize the death of Christ, who is the Bridegroom of the Church.

While every bishop wears the miter, crosier and ring, there is a special vestment worn only by *arch* bishops. It is called the pallium. It is a two inch wide circular band of white woolen cloth with black crosses on it. It is worn around the neck over the shoulders. They are a sign of being an archbishop. The pallia (which is the plural form of pallium) are blessed by the Pope and given each year to new archbishops on the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul.
